Livingston County Court House, Geneseo, in the estate settlement says 5 daughters and 3 sons or a total of 8.

Noah Hutchinson of Smyrna testifies in 1833 that he knew Aaron for about 35 years in Smyrna and that there was a daughter who died and left an heir, that she (the daughter) died long ago.

Aaron Hutchinson is listed in the 1800 Census of Sherburne but I think he came about 1795 since a 1850 census record said daughter Cynthia was born in New York.

1790 Census, Massachusetts lists Aaron in Greenfield, Massachusetts along with Jesse Hutchinson and Joseph Simons. Joseph Simons also migrated to Sherburne New York and the Hutchinson and Simons Family inter-marry there.

There is probably a relationship between Jesse, Noah and Aaron Hutchinson but proof is lacking.

Newport Mercury question column #650 and 651 says Aaron Hutchinson born near New London, Connecticut and also suggests the maiden name of the wife to be Hannah Pettingill. A descendent of Aaron Hutchinson said Hannah Nettleton.

Note: There is a grave stone for Shepard Pierce and his wife in the Livonia
Cemetery but the peculiar thing is that she is called Mary C. Pitkin, wife of
Shepard Pierce and no mention is made of Hollam Hutchinson.

Sometime in the 1840's Mary Cone Pitkin Pierce Hutchinson and Hollam
Hutchinson got involved with the State of Connecticut. This was at the time

Hollam went thru bankruptcy court in Rochester, New York and had to sign that he would not use her property other than for her benefit.

Hollam Hutchinson was a member of the assembly from Livingston County, New York, 1855. He is called miller and merchant for 20 years of Monroe and Livingston Counties. This is included in the newspaper obituary.

One time Hollam bought land with a Ward F. Mann along Honeoye Creek and Halls Mills in either Monroe or Livingston County but it might have been in Ontario County.

From an old letter I found that Arthur was ill but an infant in 1842. Lewis and M Myron were in Wheatland with the father and that the mother (Hannah Nettleton or Pettingill Hutchinson) was ill and blind in 1842. Another old letter states that the father (Aaron Hutchinson) died soon after they moved but had owned a wonderful farm. The father died in 1833.

Charles H. Pierce, son of Shepard Pierce and Mary Cone Pierce (later Hutchinson) graduated from Union College and was Secretary of the Toledo, Wabash and Great Western Railroad.

NOTE: Ephraim Finch's parents died within a short time of each other in an epidemic around 1812 or 1813 and the will filed at Batavia had to appoint guardians for the children. A Nathaniel Eggleston, William Keyes (think he is the one who later married Semantha Hutchinson or is a relative of the one who did) and a Joseph Blackman post the bond. They lived at Caledonia. There were Egglestons at or in Chenango County and perhaps Ephraim was sent back to that vicinity to live with relatives.

Since the Hutchinson Family did not leave Smyrna until around 1832 the marriages of the children should have occurred in that vicinity. The son Hollam did leave earlier and the sisters may have visited him and married in Monroe or Livingston County while on a visit.
